Dear Friends,


In 2007, we recommitted ourselves to our mission by focusing on a number of sustainability efforts. We were able to occupy the additional facility used by NJ DMV and begin the renovation project to create a new HealthCare Resource Center alongside our Wellness Center. There were difficulties and delays as we attempted to meet the building and zoning requirements from the City of Englewood. With generous support and encouragement from our friends and members, we have succeeded in laying the groundwork for our HealthCare Resource Center.

We have continued to improve and expand our services and programs, in our ongoing effort to live our values, advance our mission and to be of service to a larger community. I've highlighted some of our key activities and some of the ways FGS and our staff and volunteers are addressing our mission.

1. We celebrated our 7th anniversary by holding an inaugural Gala2007 to raise fund to expand our HealthCare Resource Center on March 17 at Marriott at Glenpointe. Our gala honorees were Dong Hwan Kim, Douglas Duchak, Chung T. Chung, MD, and Rev. Jae Hoon Lee, who were honored for their support to our community.
2. Our social service program continued to provide the NJ EASE Care Management Program serving the frail elderly for the sixth year with the grant from Bergen County, Division of Senior Services.
3. Our healthcare program served more than 1000 participants in our various health screenings and educational services. Englewood Hospital continued to be our valuable collaborator in our efforts to improve public health care. In addition, we held our second annual community health conference in October with more than 300 members participating in the event.
4. Our annually held events such as Children's Art Contest, KCC Chamber Orchestra and Chorus, Korean Traditional Dance and Music from Seniors to Youth, and Golf outing continued to improve in quality and in member participation.

We believe FGS plays a critical role in promoting wellness and healthcare for our community. As we move into our 8th year of service, we are looking for partners to help us in our endeavors. Together we can continue to provide hope and healing into each of our lives and into the lives of those all around us.



Information and Assistance

Information for healthcare and social services are continuously updated in our web site. Individual assistance and counselings are provided by FGS social workers by appointment. Brochures for hypertension and diabetes are also available in Korean. Social services seminars are conducted on every 2nd Monday and legal/financial seminars are conducted on every 3rd Monday. In 2007, 84 seniors are offered individual counseling. 38 seniors are signed up for living will.



Care Management Program for frail elderly at home

Home bound frail elderly (60+) and disabled (18-59) are visited by our trained care manager for care plan, linking to needy services and monitoring for care. In 2007, 68 clients were followed by our care manager.



Golf Outing was held on September 19, 2007 at New York Country Club. 62 golfers participated.









Basic Membership Benefits

- Members and Friends earn credit points which can be accumulated throughout the years as long as they maintain their active membership status. They earn discounts in program fees and given priorities to participate in FGS programs and services based on their earned credits as determined and approved by the president. Members and Friends can also earn credits by serving as a volunteers (Maximum annual credits: 4 points) and by participating in programs (Maximum annual credits: 4 points)

Friends of Grace Seniors(FGS) Korean Community Center

The FGS' inception was brought about by a group of motivated seniors who saw the increasing needs of the immigrants and families of a community center where they can come to share and learn, and a senior housing for retiring seniors. Grace Seniors are named for FGS senior members who are empowered to help themselves and others, and who are the anchors of the spirit of our organization.

FGS strives to provide a "heart center" where people of community gather together to learn, share, and give, as well as volunteer to teach and help others in need. It has become a place where people experience giving of themselves to help others and at the same time learn to become healthier in body, mind and spirit.

The initial program grew out of New Americans Program in YWCA, Fort Lee, Bergen County, in September, 1999. On February 16, 2000, FGS formally registered with the state of New Jersey as a non-profit organization under the leadership of Kye-Eun Ma, M.D. On September 6, 2000, FGS received an approval for 501 (c)(3) tax exempt status from the Internal Revenue Service. An alternate name of Korean Community Center was also registered with the State of New Jersey.

In 2000, FGS began with senior programs at the office space of 1,000 sq. ft. in Fort Lee, NJ. In 2004, it expanded to a newly renovated program and service center (Wellness Center) of 15,000 sq. ft. space in Englewood, NJ realizing its long-held dream of creating a Korean Community Center. In 2008, FGS has opened an additional 5,000 sq. ft. space of Healthcare Resource Center, a one-stop convenience center providing healthcare and social services. Linking Wellness Center and Healthcare Resource Center together, FGS is reaching closer to its goals in promoting healthy lifestyles and early detection of chronic diseases for the community. FGS has grown to become a strong community organization recognized by wider communities at both local and state levels, offering comprehensive and professional services and programs to address the needs of the entire community members including children and youth.

The FGS' operating fund is derived from individual and corporation contributions, grants from government and private foundations, membership dues, and program fees. It is important that "Friends" of all ages participate in building "up" of our community.
